Starting as a hose man, he faced a busy first shift with five calls. Forest firefighting wasn't his favorite, and he often recounts a harrowing experience when his crew was trapped in the middle of a wildfire. To survive, they dug a trench under their truck, filled it with water, and sheltered there until the fire passed.

Gregg served as a firefighter for 14 years, achieving the rank of captain in 1977. After leaving the fire service, he worked briefly at Copeland Lumber before beginning a 38-year career as a truck driver, retiring in 2008.

In his earlier years, Gregg enjoyed the adrenaline rush of high-speed waterskiing. Now retired, he spends his time Wii Bowling, playing Bingo with fellow residents, participating in Life Enrichment activities, and chatting with staff and visitors. Gregg has resided at the village for 9 months. Gregg was also an ordained minister for 7 years. He married people and he buried people.






