By the age of 12, Chris joined Boy Scout Troop 70 and obtained his first job peddling newspapers for "The Milwaukee Journal" and then moved on to "The Portage Daily Register Democrat". This was during the heart of WWII years. On the 26th of June 1946 Chris was sworn in as a private in the United States Marine Corp after graduating high school. In February 1951, his

enlistment expired, however, he decided to reenlist for another six years in June. It was then that he was promoted to Technical Sargent. While at the Naval Air Station, in Memphis Tennessee, Chris met his future wife Carrie in October of '51, and they were married June 5th, 1952. In September of 1954, his family and him traveled by auto cross country to the Marine Corps Air Station in Cherry Point, North Carolina and he served there until 1959. While here, He also served as a teacher at a young adult Sunday School Class. During October 1960, he was deployed to Okinawa, The Philippines, Taiwan, and South Korea. Chris and his family moved to Oregon in 1973. On October 27th, 2014, Chris moved into our Independent Living facility, until eventually moving over to The Village last June. Chris served our country in the Marines from 1946 until 1968. We thank him for his service. Now, Chris enjoys visiting with staff, family, other residents, and loves to tell stories from his past. He has written an autobiography that details his entire life and is very interesting to read!


